## What is It About ?

Mother's Outreach Network is continuing "Mother Up", a guaranteed income research program for mothers in DC with children in the foster system or other people's home due to CFSA involvement. Eligible mothers selected may receive \$500 a month for 36 months. A randomizer will decide which eligible mothers receive the cash benefits.

## Who\* Qualifies?

Roughly speaking, mothers who:

- Are age 18 or older
- Speak English
- Live in Washington, DC – specifically in wards 4, 5,6,7, or 8 – or currently experiencing housing instability
- Are eligible to receive public benefits (such as TANF)
- Are not receiving Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits\*\*
- Are a biological mother to a child age 14 or younger who
- has been or was removed from their household within the last year prior to enrollment
- The eligible child has been or was removed from the home of the qualifying mother at the initiation of legal action by the DC Child & Family Services Agency (CFSA)/Child Protective Services (CPS) within the last year prior to program enrollment; or has been removed from the qualifying mother's home as a result of extra judicial action by the DC CFSA/CPS within the last year prior to program enrollment.

\* Not all eligible applications are guaranteed to be selected for the Mother Up program.

\*\* Participation in the Mother Up program could result in the loss of some or all of one's SSI benefits.
